


William P. Murphy, Jr., M.D. Chairman of the Board and Chief Executive Officer, Hyperion, Inc.

Dr. Murphy obtained his medical degree at the University of Illinois School of Medicine. Prior to that, he attended Harvard University and Massachusetts Institute of Technology. During his long career, Dr. Murphy spent two years as an Instructor in Medicine at Harvard Medical School, was a Blood Transfusion Consultant for the U.S. military in Korea, and was a founding member of the American Society of Artificial Internal Organs. In 1959, Dr. Murphy founded Cordis Corporation, where he served as Chairman of the Board and Chief Executive Officer until 1985. In 1963, he founded Small Parts, Inc. in Miami Lakes. At 63, Dr. Murphy obtained his Helicopter pilot license. Among his many awards, Dr. Murphy received the Corporate Leadership Award from M.I.T., and the Distinguished Service Award from the North American Society of Pacing & Electrophysiology. Dr. Murphy holds or co-holds 17 U.S. patents; most notable are the Cardiac Pacer with redundant Power Supply and Cardiac Pacer Electrode System. Dr. Murphy is also a member of the M.I.T. Corporation Visiting Committee and the Advisory Committee to the Harvard-M.I.T. Division of Health Sciences & Technology.
